## 11TH GRADE

### ACADEMIC PLANNING

- ↓ All students will revisit, and update the 6-year plan.
- ↓ Students will be provided with support to earn a C grade or better in all classes.
- ↓ All students will take the SBAC state assessment.
- ↓ Students will be provided with opportunities to complete 10 hours of civic learning required for graduation.
- ↓ Students will continue to have the opportunity to enroll in Career Technical Education (CTE) Pathway courses.
- ↓ Students will have the opportunity to enroll in dual enrollment courses for high school and college credit—these are provided by the community college partners.
- ↓ Students will continue to plan for their Capstone project.
- ↓ Strong focus on: Critical thinking, Collaboration, Creativity, Communication, and Character (Five “C”s).
- ↓ All students will write as a tool for learning in all their classes.

### COLLEGE & CAREER PLANNING

- ↓ All 11th grade students will participate Junior Push. Students will have their transcripts evaluated, plan for 12th grade, and be provided with tailored support based on their goals after high school.
- ↓ Students will complete an essay in their English classes, which will support the UC Personal Insight Questions.
- ↓ All students will be invited to attend the Anaheim Union High School District College and Career Fair in October.
- ↓ Students will learn about opportunities offered through the Anaheim Innovative Mentoring Experience (AIME) and will be invited to apply to the summer internship program.
- ↓ Students will participate in a guidance lesson on a Social Emotional topic.

### PARENT ENGAGEMENT

- ↓ Parents will have an opportunity to review the 6-year plan and work with the school counselor to make any adjustments.
- ↓ Parents will be invited to actively participate in workshops about college and the admissions process.
- ↓ Parents will be invited to participate in an eight-week course, Parent Leadership Academy 1.0, to learn how to best support their child in school.
- ↓ Parents will be invited to participate in the Parent Leadership Academy 2.0 to have in depth understanding of college and career readiness.
- ↓ Parents will be invited to Parent Learning Walks to learn about how to best support their child’s learning.

### PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

- ↓ All staff will be provided professional learning on First Best Instruction.
- ↓ All staff will learn about opportunities to fund a post-secondary education. (FAFSA, DREAM, Scholarships).
- ↓ AUHSD faculty will participate in colloquiums with higher education faculty to better align curriculum.

## 12TH GRADE

### ACADEMIC PLANNING

- ↓ All students will update the 6-year plan consisting to ensure that they are on track for high school graduation, and have the opportunity to complete A-G requirements.
- ↓ Students will be encouraged to enroll and successfully pass a 4th year of Math their senior year.
- ↓ Students will be provided with support to earn a C grade or better in all classes.
- ↓ Students will have the opportunity to enroll in dual enrollment courses for high school and college credit—these are provided by community college partners.
- ↓ All 12th grade students may present their Capstone/Senior project—this is a culminating project consisting of work during grades 9-12 and includes a transcription reflection, resume, evidence of a post-secondary plan, and evidence of FAFSA/Dream Act submission.
- ↓ Students will be provided with opportunities to complete 10 hours of civic learning required for graduation.
- ↓ Students who have met all requirements, will be eligible for the Seal of Billiteracy.
- ↓ Strong focus on: Critical thinking, Collaboration, Creativity, Communication, and Character (Five “C”s)
- ↓ All students will write as a tool for learning in all their classes.

### COLLEGE & CAREER PLANNING

- ↓ All students will participate in the Educational Pledge Day that provides seniors with the opportunity to work on submitting college applications, and community college placement exams, and other career options.
- ↓ Students will learn about opportunities offered through the Anaheim Innovative Mentoring Experience (AIME) and work-based learning.
- ↓ Students will participate in a guidance lesson on personal and health success.
